

A. Primarily there must be accommodation available that would be suitable for an applicant providing that the criteria listed under points B & C are met.

1. Single rooms
 - Some single rooms have been allocated as either male or female accommodation, and applicants of one gender will not be housed in accommodation allocated to the other. Some single rooms are suitable for either sex.
 - Single accommodation will not normally be offered to a couple or family.
2. Double rooms
 - Double rooms are intended for couples without children. Couples with a baby or small child (less than 12 months old at the end of their stay) may be offered double accommodation in flat B.
 - Single applicants may be offered double accommodation if double accommodation is still available 6 weeks before the resident's arrival date.
 - Couples where one of them has previously lived in UK will only be offered accommodation in exceptional circumstances.
3. Family accommodation
 - Family flats are provided for couples with one or two children under the age of 10. The Lodge is suitable for families with up to three children (with no age limit).
 - Couples without children may be offered family accommodation (subject to availability) but only when double accommodation is fully booked.
 - Single parent families may be offered accommodation (subject to availability) if plans for good child-care arrangements are presented with the application for accommodation.
 - Single applicants will not be offered family accommodation.
 - Families where one of them has previously lived in UK will only be offered accommodation in exceptional circumstances.

B. To be considered for accommodation, an applicant must be

1. a postgraduate student studying at a university in Oxford, or an academic visitor to those institutions.
 - Post-graduate students or academics at another recognised university outside the UK, using the research facilities in Oxford, may also be offered accommodation.
 - Undergraduates may be accepted, if it is thought that they are more suited to NOOC than college life, but this is not encouraged since colleges are responsible for undergraduate accommodation.
 - Post-doc's will only be considered if they require family accommodation and have young children.
 - Students from language schools, private colleges, colleges of further education, and institutions outside Oxford will generally not be accepted, only if bookings are very low.
2. a permanent resident outside the UK.
 - Priority will be given to students from developing countries.
 - The nationalities of current or expected residents will be considered to ensure a multicultural environment within the Centre. The number of lettings to residents from any nation should not exceed 7, and from the EU, Switzerland and Norway should not exceed 25 unless bookings are low or it has proved to be impossible to fill a room with people from other nations.
 - The Departments / Faculties / Centres of current or expected residents will be considered to ensure a multidisciplinary environment. The number of lettings to residents from any department/ faculty/ Centre should not exceed 7, unless bookings are very low.

Accommodation will not be offered to those who are currently resident within the UK, unless bookings are low.

3. over the age of 21.
 - This criterion will be revoked only at the discretion of the Director.
4. studying full time during their stay in Oxford, or working full time as an academic visitor during their stay in Oxford.
5. a member of Staff, Community builder or Duty Warden whose job description requires them to live on site.

C. In situations where there are more applicants than accommodation available, and the above criteria are equally met, the following needs of the applicants will be considered:

1. the financial need for reasonably priced accommodation.
2. the need for the support of the NOOC environment.
3. the need for the type of accommodation at NOOC because the length of stay makes commercial rent impossible.
4. the need to provide accommodation for dependants.

D. Length of stay

1. Students on full time courses will not normally stay at the Centre for more than two years. An application to the Board of Management for an extension to this limit may be submitted, but will only be granted in exceptional circumstances.
2. Academic visitors and Post Doc's may stay at the Centre for up to 1 year. Overseas Academic visitors who return to Oxford in subsequent years will be allowed to stay but for no longer than 3 months in any academic year and only on condition they arrive from and depart to their main residence which is outside the UK.
3. Up to 25 bookings (including up to 15 from Europe) will be accepted before 1st September for Michaelmas term.
4. Those staying for two terms or less may shorten their stay by up to one week as long as their new departure date is not in term time, by giving at least 28 days notice of the change. Those who have stayed at the centre for two or more terms and who are leaving their course may give us no less than 28 days' notice of their departure.
5. Bookings for less than 2 weeks during vacations will only be accepted with the approval of a Director.
6. During term time bookings for less than a term will only be accepted if
 - A suitable room becomes availableOr
 - It is deemed to be too late in the season to find a booking for a particular unit of accommodation for the whole termOr
 - Two or more applications for accommodation have been received which, when combined, fill a room for most of a term.

E Acceptance of bookings

Bookings will not be accepted further in advance than the least of the following:

- 1) No further than 6 months in advance
2. No further in advance than the planned length of stay.

F Appeal Procedure

A resident or prospective resident may appeal to the Director for cases involving the interpretation of the above policy. Policy changes may only be made by the Housing Management Group with the approval of the Board of Management. In the unlikely event that a resident or prospective resident is still not satisfied after explaining his or her case to the Housing Management Group and the Board, he or she may appeal to the Independent Housing Ombudsman Service at PO Box 152, Liverpool, L33 7QW. Guest Policy

Guidance relating to guests

Welcoming strangers and offering hospitality is a part of our Christian ethos, as is our intention to make residents feel that the Centre is their Home away from Home, so when deciding whether or not to have a guest

1. Please apply the same standards that you would apply at home in front of your family and friends,
2. Please be considerate of your neighbours at the Centre who come from many different cultural backgrounds, most of whom have come to have a quiet place in which to live and study.
3. Please ensure guests use appropriate toilet and shower facilities in an area designated for either their sex or for unisex usage.

Guest Policy

We welcome for a short stay the husband, wife or relative of a resident, or a visiting friend.

- If you live in a single room you may have one guest in your room; in a double room or family flat you may have two guests.
- Residents having guest(s) to stay must complete a guest reservation form.
- Guest(s) may be accommodated in a separate room, or in the resident's room, depending on availability and suitability, or in the room of a friend already resident at the Centre (subject to that friend's agreement).
- Guest(s) younger than 18 years old will only be accepted once the host has met with the Director and outlined an appropriate and acceptable child care plan.
- Guest(s) are expected to keep the same rules as residents.
- To limit the impact of guests on other residents
 - Guest(s) may stay over night for up to ten days during term time and up to 15 days during vacations.
 - A resident may have no more than 20 guest days per 4 month period (one guest day is one guest staying for one night).
 - A resident may not invite more than 5 daytime visitors to the Centre at any one time (except during the summer for a barbeque in the garden when no more than 7 daytime guests may be invited)
- A charge will be made for guests' overnight stay, according to the level of accommodation provided.

We reserve the right to refuse accommodation to guests.
